



To access your Amazon Wish List settings, click the “Your Account” menu on the top right side of the screen. Select “Your Lists” from the menu.




This will bring up the “Wish List” page. Click “List Settings” on the right side of the page




On the next screen, you can change your lists from “Public” to “Private”. Click “Submit”.




To access additional Amazon privacy settings, click “Your Account” on the top right of the screen on the Amazon home page.



Under the “Personalization” section, click “Your Public Profile.”




This will allow you to see your profile as others see it. This includes your name, profile photo, reviews, and purchases. Click Edit Profile, then select Edit privacy settings to access your profile settings.




Under Your Public Activity, you can click “Hide All Activity on Your Profile” to make your account information private. You can also “View Your Profile as a Visitor” to ensure all the information is properly secured. In addition, you can select “Hide sensitive activity” to ensure that any activity on your account deemed asensitive’ will be automatically hidden. It is also recommended that you do **NOT** allow customers to follow you.

You can turn off this setting to prevent this. Learn more'.


Return to “Your Account” and scroll to the “Personalization” section, then click “Your Social Settings.”




This will allow you to see what social media accounts (i.e. Facebook, Twitter) that you have connected to your Amazon account. It is recommended that you DO NOT connect your social media accounts with your Amazon account.




Return to “Your Account” and scroll to the “Personalization” section, then click “View and Manage Your Browsing History.”



Select “Manage History” in the top right corner. This allows you to turn your browsing history on or off. It is recommended that you turn your browsing history **Off**. Following that, select “Remove all items”. This will delete your browsing history.



Return to “Your Account” and scroll to the “Personalization” section, then click “Your Advertising Preferences.”



From this page, you can decide if you would like for Amazon to provide you with personalized ads. It is recommended that you select “Do Not”.
