SERGEANT MARCO L. MILLER
Killed in Action on December 5, 2006
Operation Iraqi Freedom

Sgt. Marco L. Miller was born on March 18, 1970, in Warren, Ohio. He was a combat cameraman assigned to the 3rd Battalion Support Company, 20th Special Forces Group (Airborne), Camp Blanding, Fla.

He died Dec. 5, 2006, from wounds sustained during a mortar attack in the vicinity of Taji, Iraq.

Miller lived most recently in Longwood, Fla. He enlisted in the Army Nov. 1990, as a chemical operations specialist and left the service in 1994. Following the events of Sept. 11th, he enlisted in the Florida National Guard as a decontamination specialist assigned to 3rd Bn., 20th SFG (A) in Jan. 2002.

Miller's awards and decorations include the Purple Heart, Army Reserve Components Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Southwest Asia Service Medal with Bronze Service Star, Iraq Campaign Medal, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Armed Forces Reserve Medal with "M" device, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon and Parachutist Badge.

Miller is survived by his mother Renee Miller of Warren, Ohio, brother Demond Miller of Fern Park, Fla., and sisters Kim Miller and Meka Miller of Dale City, Va.
