Battaion, 19th SFG (A), Camp Williams, Utah, as a Special Forces engineer sergeant. He mobilized in support of Operation Freedom's Sentinel, April 1, 2017.

His military education includes the Combat Engineer Course, Airborne School, Special Forces Qualification Course, Special Forces Engineer Sergeant Qualification Course (Distinguished Honor Graduate), Basic Special Operations Language Training (French), Advanced Leader Course, and Military Free Fall Parachutist Course.

His awards and decorations include the Bronze Star, Purple Heart, Army Commendation Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Noncommissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon (2), Army Reserve Component Overseas Training Ribbon, Special Forces Tab, Military Free Fall Parachutist Badge, and Parachutist Badge.
