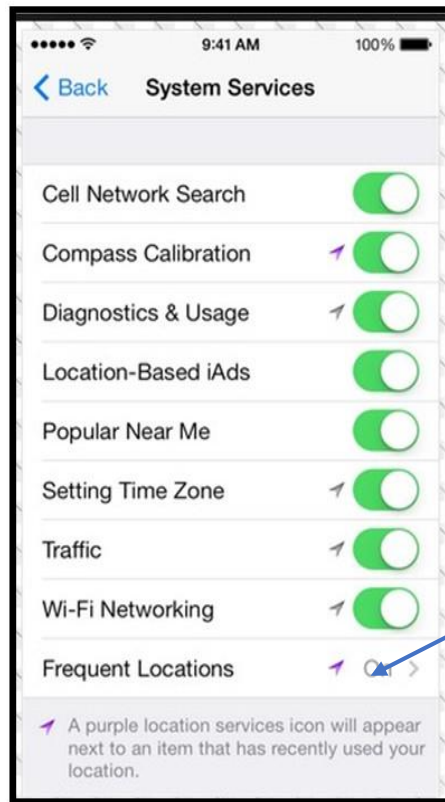
Under "Settings", select "Privacy"



Select "Location Services".



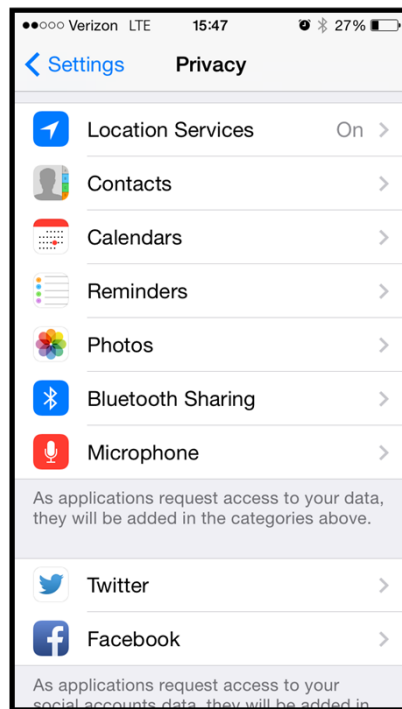
Under "Location Services", you can see every app that is utilizing your location. Scroll to the bottom and select "System Services".



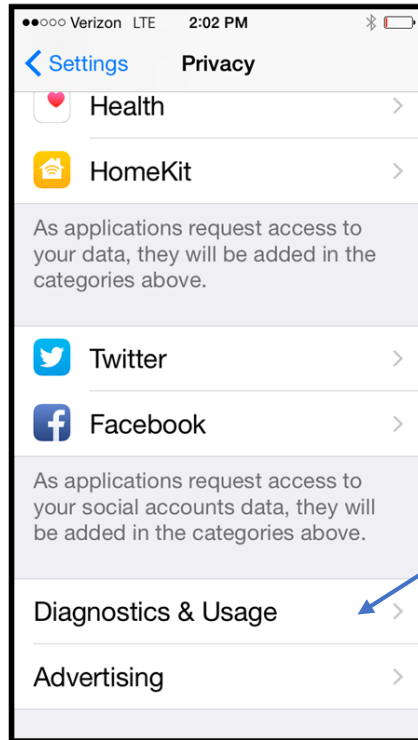
Scroll to the bottom and select "Frequent Locations".



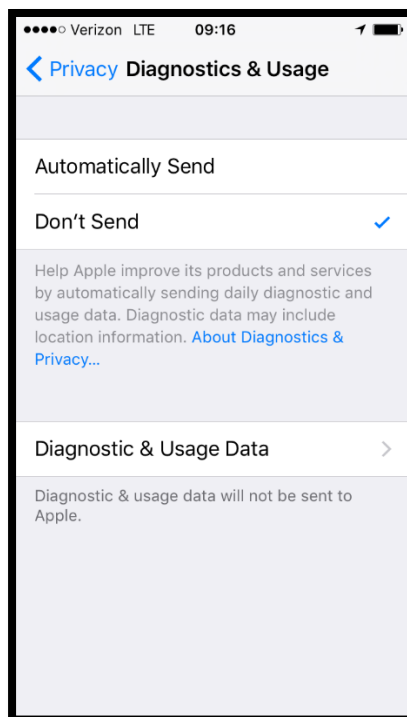
In "Frequent Locations", you can see everywhere your phone has tracked your location. It is recommended that you clear your history and turn the "Frequent Locations" off.



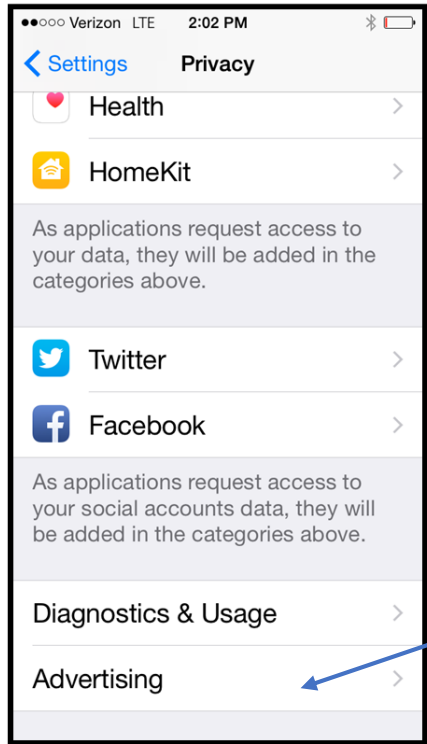
Return to the "Privacy" screen.



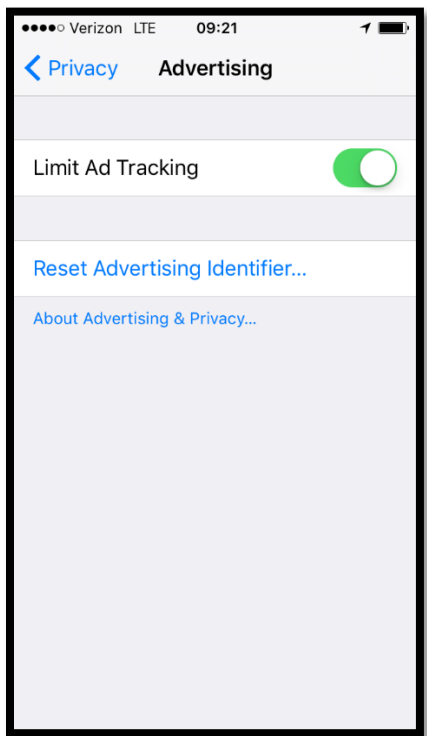
Scroll to the bottom and select “Diagnostics and Usage”.



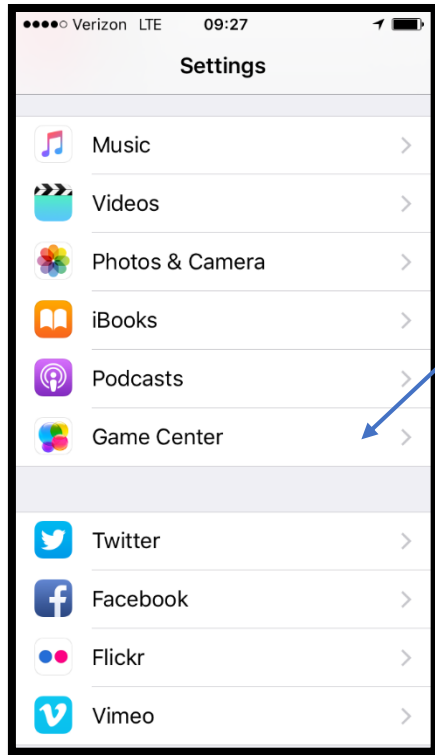
It is recommended that you select “Don’t Send”. This will prevent your operating system from sending daily information to Apple concerning your usage.



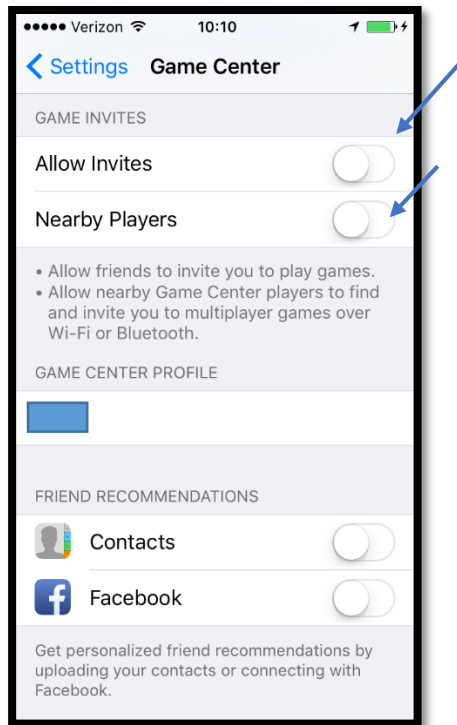
Return to the “Privacy” screen. Select “Advertising”.



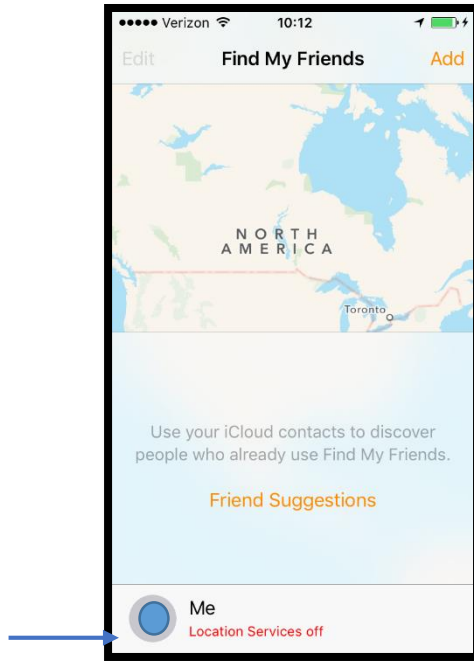
It is recommended that you turn on the “Limit Ad Tracking” function. This will prevent your phone from tracking your actions concerning advertisements.



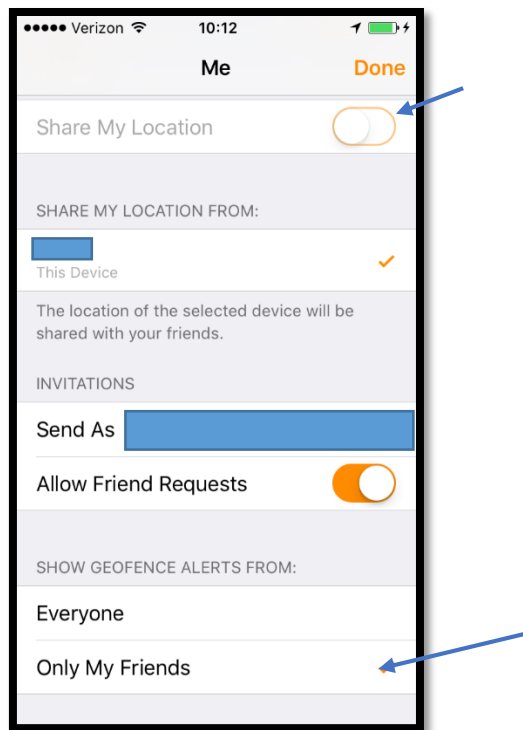
Under "Settings", select "Game Center".
