
Changing Your Privacy Settings

Customize who can send you Snaps and see your Stories in Settings.


By default, only users you add to your friends list can send you Snaps. If a Snapchatter you haven't added as a friend tries to send you a Snap, you'll receive a notification that they added you, but you will not receive the Snap they sent unless you add them to your friends list.

How to change who can send me Snaps


1. Tap  at the top of your camera screen.
2. Tap  in the top right hand corner of your Profile screen.




Select "Contact Me" under "Who Can..."




It is recommended that you select “My Friends” so only your selected friends can send you snaps, chat, call, etc.




Return to the settings menu. Select “View My Story”.




It is recommended that you select “My Friends” so only your friends can view your story.



Return to the Settings Menu. Select "See Me in Quick Add".



Under “Quick Add” it is recommended that you turn this feature off.




Opting Out of Find Friends

If you have used 'Find Friends' to search for your friends or if you go to Settings and 'Allow friends to find me,' friends with your phone number will be able to find you. If you later decide that you do not want friends to find you on Snapchat through your phone number:

Tap  on the upper right corner of the Profile screen.






It is recommended that you do not allow friends to find you via your mobile number.

Snap Map: a new location based Snapchat feature

On the Snap Map, you can view Snaps submitted to Our Story from all across the world — including sporting events, celebrations, breaking news, and more 🌍 You and your friends can also share your locations with one another, and see what’s going on around you!




Snap Map location settings

- If you and a friend have both added one another on Snapchat, you can choose to share your locations with each other on the Snap Map 🌐
- **Your location on the Snap Map only updates when you have Snapchat open** — so you don't have to worry about your location being updated in the background 🚫
- Your location on the Map will expire after several hours, or as soon as you go into Ghost Mode 🗿 If you tap on a friend's Bitmoji, it'll show you how long it's been since their location was last updated!

Location Sharing Options

When you open the Snap Map for the first time, you'll get a prompt to choose who you'd like to share your location with.

- **Only Me (Ghost Mode):** Your location won't be visible to anyone else on the Map! When you're in Ghost Mode, your Bitmoji will hold up a blue sign with a 🗿 icon.
- **Select Friends....:** Choose specific friends to share your location with! Friends you select aren't notified when you choose them. If a friend isn't appearing in this list, it could be because they haven't added you as a friend on Snapchat.
- **My Friends:** Your location will be shared with all of your friends — including friends you add in the future! This option doesn't include people who've added you as a friend, but who you haven't added back. If you choose this option, we'll check in from time to time to make sure you still want to share your location with all of your friends.



To edit your location settings, just tap the settings (⚙️) button in the top-right corner of the Map screen. You can change who can see your location, or you can hide your location altogether by going into Ghost Mode 🗿

Warning 🚨 Snaps you submit to [Our Story](#) can still show up on the Map, no matter what location setting you choose!
