## COMMAND SGT. MAJ. JOHN A. CONDROSKI

Command Sergeant Major John A. Condroski is a native of Chattanooga, Tennessee, and graduated from Red Bank High School. Command Sgt. Maj. Condroski enlisted in the Army in 1984 as a 42D Dental Laboratory Technician, attending Advanced Individual Training at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, followed by his first assignment to Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington, D.C.

Command Sgt. Maj. Condroski reclassified as a 96F, Psychological Operations Specialist and attended Advanced Individual Training at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, in 1988. His assignments include Headquarters Support Company and Co. A, 8th PSYOP Bn. (Airborne); Headquarters U.S. Army Central Command, Fort McPherson, Georgia; HSC and Product Development Company, 6th PSYOP Battalion (Airborne); Proponency Office, United States Army John F. Kennedy Special Warfare Center and School, Fort Bragg; Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 4th PSYOP Group (Airborne); Joint Military Information Support Command, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida; and Command Sergeant Major, 6th Psychological Operations Battalion (Airborne), 8th Psychological Operations Battalion (Airborne), 8th Military Information Support Group (Airborne); and the 4th Military Information Support Group (Airborne) at Fort Bragg. Command Sgt. Maj. Condroski's final duty assignment was at the John F. Kennedy Special Warfare Center and School where he served as the PSYOP Commandant Sergeant Major.

Command Sgt. Maj. Condroski has served in every leadership position within the PSYOP community including team leader, squad leader, platoon sergeant, battalion operations sergeant, first sergeant, sergeant major and command sergeant major at battalion and group levels. He has deployed in numerous contingency operations, including Operations Desert Shield, Desert Storm, Provide Comfort, Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom. He has also supported multiple operational missions throughout the world.

Command Sgt. Maj. Condroski's military and civilian education includes: Professional Leadership Course, Basic Noncommissioned Officers Course, Basic Military Language Course (Arabic), Advanced Noncommissioned Officers Course, First Sergeant Course, United States Navy Senior Enlisted Academy (Class 123), Airborne and Jumpmaster School. He holds a bachelor of science and a master's in business administration.

Command Sgt. Maj. Condroski's awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal; Meritorious Service Medal with five oak-leaf clusters; Army Commendation Medal with five oak-leaf clusters; Joint Service Achievement Medal; Army Achievement Medal with six oak-leaf clusters; Humanitarian Service Medal; Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal; Armed Forces Service Medal; German Armed Forces Proficiency Badge (Gold); Major General Robert A. McClure Medal (Silver); Master Parachutist Badge; British, Thai and Italian Parachutists Badges; and numerous service and campaign medals. Command Sgt. Maj. Condroski is a Centurion Jumpmaster with more than 100 Military Static Line Jumps.
