

Condition Statement Sample. The following is an example condition statement written for a MET and is based on a UJT for Conduct Unconventional Warfare.

The Special Forces element receives an Execution Order (EXORD) to conduct unconventional warfare from higher headquarters to support United States government objectives in a specific area of operations. Unconventional warfare is authorized under title 10 and title 50, United States Code as is required. The element conducts mission planning using the appropriate planning processes as the mission dictates. The element is partially integrated with the supporting USG agencies applicable to the mission. A military liaison element may or may not be present in the operating area. Area studies are completed and available. Initial contact is not established with the resistance leaders or forces. The resistance forces are identified but the composition and disposition of the resistance is unknown. The operating environment is denied and may include multiple threats, with varying degrees of capability. The operating environment is fluid and some activities may be covert or clandestine in nature. Rules of Engagement and Rules of Interaction are provided.

The condition statement for this task is written assuming the highest training conditions reflected on the Task Proficiency matrix required for the evaluated unit to receive a fully trained (T) rating.

Condition term definitions:

Dynamic Operational Environment: Requires operational variables and threat TTPs for assigned counter-tasks to change in response to the execution of this task.

Complex Operational Environment: Requires a minimum of four (terrain, time, military (threat), and social (population) or more operational variables; the unit requires all PMESII-PT factors be replicated in varying degrees based on the task.

Notice that it is generic enough to be used in multiple operational environments and that it uses joint terminology and conditions. That allows the scenario developers to design training specific to the commander's training objectives without compromising the quality of the training. All tasks should be used in conjunction with the Combined Arms Training Strategy for the unit.
